

**Chief, Division of Cardiology

The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center is seeking an accomplished and dynamic leader to serve as Chief of the Division of Cardiology. Appointment rank will be commensurate with academic accomplishments and experience. Reporting directly to the Chair of Internal Medicine, this individual will lead a diverse, dedicated team of outstanding cardiologists, innovative researchers, and enthusiastic educators who value close, collaborative relationships, in a division that has had only three chiefs since 1977: James Willerson (1977-1990), R. Sanders Williams (1990-2001), and Joseph Hill (2001-present). The ideal candidate will be a committed leader with deep expertise in cardiology, both from the clinical and scientific perspectives. The candidate must also meet the following requirements:

- Doctor of Medicine (MD) or Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine (DO) or foreign equivalent
- Certification by the American Board of Internal Medicine in Cardiovascular Disease and eligible for an unrestricted license to practice medicine in Texas
- Distinguished record and national reputation in scholarly achievement, including research
- Commitment to medical education, including teaching and training medical and graduate students, house staff, and fellows
- Commitment to lead and support efforts to enhance the climate of diversity, equity, and inclusion in all aspects of the Division

Cardiology Division, Facilities & Services:

- Ninety-five faculty members, including specialists in every aspect of modern cardiology
- Four ACGME-accredited fellowship programs with 40 fellows
- Cardiology services provided primarily at Parkland Memorial Hospital, Clements University Hospital, Dallas VA Medical Center, and their affiliated clinics throughout the region
- Full spectrum of clinical subspecialty services, including prevention of cardiovascular disease to heart transplantation

Research Collaboration:

- Collaboration with other departments and centers, Hamon Center for Regenerative Science and Medicine (Director, Dr. Eric Olson), McDermott Center for Human Genetics (Director, Dr. Helen Hobbs), Department of Molecular Genetics (Chair, Dr. Joseph Goldstein), Moss Heart Center (Director, Dr. Joseph Hill), Touchstone Diabetes Center (Director, Dr. Philip Scherer), and Clinical Informatics Center (Director, Dr. Christopher Lehmann).
- Current and future research opportunities involving lipid biology, cardiovascular genetics, myocardial biology, cardiac regeneration, and heart failure pathogenesis
- Clinical and translational research programs examining prevention, risk prediction, genetics, biomarker discovery, hemodynamic adaptations to exercise, cardio-oncology, and hypertension
- Dedicated T32 training grant for cardiovascular research
- Active participation in epidemiologic and community-based cohorts, including the Dallas Heart Study
