The University of Arizona (UArizona) College of Medicine – Tucson invites applications for the position of Chief, Division of Cardiology in the Department of Medicine and Director of the Sarver Heart Center. This is an exceptional opportunity for a transformative leader to help grow our presence and impact in Southern Arizona and beyond; promote patient care through *state-of-the-art* diagnostics and therapeutics; expand an already strong cohort of faculty, fellows, students, and staff; augment and expand basic and translational research and clinical trial activities; and further strengthen the tripartite mission of the College.

Position Description

Reporting to the Dean of the College of Medicine as Director of Sarver Heart Center and to the Chair of the Department of Medicine as the Division Chief, the incumbent will work collaboratively with the leaders of the College and Banner – University Medicine to further the tripartite mission of achieving excellence in clinical care, education, and individual and team-based research. This individual will be a visionary, accomplished leader with demonstrated achievements in cardiovascular research and clinical operations and will be comfortable setting ambitious goals and strategies. Furthermore, this individual is expected to be actively involved in significant philanthropic and outreach activities that has been a cornerstone of the Sarver Heart Center; practice transparent, collaborative leadership, and create a culture of mentorship, scholarship and innovation including effective partnerships with community agencies, health-related organizations, and governmental entities, with a focus on faculty recruitment and retention efforts that support the departments objectives.

The University of Arizona

UArizona is a premier research institution. The National Science Foundation ranks the university 21st in research and development expenditures among U.S. public and private universities. The Blue Ridge Institute for Medical Research ranks UArizona 50 of 140 institutions for NIH funding in 2021. UArizona is home to the University of Arizona Health Sciences (UAHS), which includes The University of Arizona Cancer Center, the only National Cancer Institute-designated Comprehensive Cancer Center headquartered in the state of Arizona.

Banner University Medicine

In 2015, Banner Health merged with the University of Arizona Health Network to form Banner University Medicine. At the heart of this merger is academic medicine - research, teaching and patient care - across three academic medical centers in Tucson and Phoenix. Banner University Medicine's presence in Tucson includes the Banner - University Medical Center Tucson, Banner - University Medical Center South and the Diamond Children's Medical Center, and dozens of physician offices and clinics across Southern Arizona. Banner - University Medical Center Tucson opened a tower in 2019 featuring 228 new private rooms, for a total of 649, and 20 new operating rooms. The hospital is located near the campus of the University of Arizona and is adjacent to the University of Arizona College of Medicine.
