



**Open Tenure Track Faculty Positions with the Native American Center for Cancer Health Equity (NACCHE) at the Stephenson Cancer Center (SCC) University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center**

Full-time faculty positions available with appointment at the level of Assistant, Associate, or Full Professor. As SCC is a matrix cancer center, successful applicants will be appointed in an academic department relevant to their area of expertise. Rank, salary, and tenure eligibility commensurate with qualifications and experience.

**Required Qualifications**

- Doctoral-level degree in a health-related field.
- Experience in, and/or commitment to, advancing work in tribal communities.

**Preferred Qualifications:** Research experience in one or more of the following areas:

- Native American health disparities in cancer and/or health promotion research
- Ethics of Tribal research and/or Indigenous research methodologies
- Health services or intervention research
- Social determinants of health
- Community-engaged/community-based participatory research with Indigenous communities

**Salary:** These faculty positions offer extremely competitive salaries and generous start-up packages.

**General:** The NCI Designated SCC is Oklahoma's only academic cancer center. SCC investigators conduct numerous tribally engaged research projects to reduce the impact of cancer in Native American persons.

**NACCHE's Vision** is to advance health equity for all Native American people by reducing cancer risk and improving cancer survival. **Our Mission** is to reduce the high rates of cancer among Native American people by improving cancer health delivery and outcomes, conducting tribally informed research, creating education opportunities for Native American students in the health and biomedical sciences, engaging in meaningful Tribal consultation and respecting Tribal sovereignty.
