The Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology is seeking qualified candidates to provide specialty care in Urogynecology and Reconstructive Pelvic Surgery to patients at VCU Health. The Urogynecology faculty member will see specialty specific patients in clinic, perform diagnostic procedures such as urodynamics, and will have an active surgical practice, which will include minimally invasive and robotic procedures. The position will include participation in student and resident education as well as participating in the department's clinical research activities. Department faculty are responsible for providing services to their profession and to the University Community.

**Preferred Qualifications:**

- Completion of an ACGME accredited OB/GYN residency and ABOG or ACGME accredited fellowship in Urogynecology and Reconstructive Pelvic Surgery
- Demonstrated talent and experience in teaching and commitment to research and patient care
- BC/BE by the American Board of OB/GYN in Obstetrics and Gynecology
